

TWO DMACC BASEBALL PLAYERS NAMED ALL-AMERICANS

DMACC infielder Jake Astor (top rigt) of North Liberty and pitcher Patrick Cooper of Danville, KY, have been named to the 2009 National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Division II All-American First Team. With the announcement, Astor becomes a two-time All-American because he also was named to the 2008 NJCAA All American First Team. Astor and Cooper were the only players from an lowa college to be named to the prestigious team this year. Astor was also named National Division II Player of the Year. That selection was made by the American Baseball Coaches Association, in conjunction with the NJCAA. Earlier, Astor and Cooper were named to the 2009 North Plains All-District Team and to the lowa Community College Athletic Conference (ICCAC) All-Region First Team.

Astor is also one of only four DMACC players to hit .400 or better in both of his years at the community college level. Astor hit .442 in his freshman season and .444 this year.





Cooper, who had an 8-1 record with four complete games in his 13 starts for the Bears this season, also set a single-season strikeout record for a pitcher with 106. He had a 3.48 earned run average and opponents hit only .204 off of him this year. Cooper gave up only 55 hits in 72 $^{1}/_{3}$ innings on the mound. Astor and Cooper led the DMACC Bears to the NJCAA Division II College World Series both years, playing for DMACC Head Baseball Coach Dan Fitzgerald. The DMACC Bears finished with a team 55–11 record, a single-season record .833 winning percentage and a 103–29 record in the two seasons Fitzgerald has been head coach.

Astor has signed a national letter of intent to play baseball at Southern Arkansas next year while Cooper will be playing at Bradley University.

ROBBINS NAMED TO RAWLINGS 2009 GOLD GLOVE TEAM

DMACC second baseman Tyler Robbins of Bettendorf has been named a 2009 National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Division II Rawlings Gold Glove Award® recipient. Robbins committed only five errors all season en route to a .972 fielding percentage. The Rawlings Gold Glove Award® is the benchmark of excellence and performance on the diamond in Major League Baseball. In 2007, the award began to also symbolize the best of the best at the collegiate and high school levels.



MCGINN NAMED DMACC'S NEW MEN'S HEAD BASKETBALL COACH

BJ McGinn (clipboard in hand) has been named the new head coach for the DMACC Bears men's basketball team. He served as Associate Head Coach for the 2008–2009 season and as an assistant coach in previous seasons at DMACC. During his three seasons with the Bears, McGinn has helped guide them to a record of 75–22. The 2006–07 Bears compiled a school best record of 31–5, won the Region 11 championship, advanced to the Elite Eight, and finished the season ranked fifth in the country. The 2007–08 Bears finished with a record of 24–6 and a final national ranking of seventh. The 2008–2009 team finished with a record of 20–11 and advanced to the regional semi-finals. During this period, the Bears have had 11 All-Region performers and 2 All-Americans.

McGinn is a native of Cedar Falls and earned his bachelor's degree in secondary education from the University of Northern Iowa in 2001. He holds a master's degree in athletic administration from Wayne State College. He resides in Boone with his wife, Alisha, and their son, Cole.
