VICTIMS OF CRIMES MEMORIAL

DMACC Photography Professor Curt Stahr and his students, in conjunction with DMACC's Criminal Justice Club, have developed a memorial to crime victims. The memorial is now hanging in the north/south hallway of Bldg. #3W on the Ankeny Campus. The idea came about after DMACC student Elizabeth White was tragically killed by an intoxicated driver on Interstate 80 in 2007. Her father, Kirby White, contacted John Stites, the faculty representative of the DMACC Criminal Justice Club, and contributed funds in Elizabeth's memory for any kind of project the club might envision. The crime victims memorial features Elizabeth, but also makes a strong statement about the trauma that crime victims endure in our society.

The DMACC Criminal Justice Club will formally unveil the memorial at 5:45 p.m., Tues., Feb. 15, in the hallway of Bldg. #3W. Following that event, a panel of crime victims, including Kirby White, will discuss their experiences starting at 6 p.m. in the Bldg. #5 Quiet Lounge.
