#### STATEMENT TO THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS DES MOINES AREA COMMUNITY COLLEGE PROPOSED FY 1994-95 BUDGET

#### BY ERIC BURMEISTER, CHAIRPERSON SCHOOLS COMMITTEE POLK DES MOINES TAXPAYERS ASSOCIATION

Good afternoon Mr. Chairperson and members of the Board, my name is Eric Burmeister.

I live at 328 38th Place in Des Moines and I am appearing at this hearing on behalf of the Polk-Des Moines Taxpayers Association.

On behalf of the Schools Committee of the Association I would like to thank Dr. Borgen, Darrell Roberts and Don Zuck for their time with us on February 23rd. It is always a pleasure to have the staff explain the details of the new budget and especially for Dr. Borgen's personal insights on the future of the community college system in general and DMACC specifically.

After a review of the budget by staff, a report to the Committee and finally the Association's Board of Directors, I am pleased to report that the Association supports your FY95 budget. As a taxpayers' organization we are always pleased to see any jurisdiction consistently keep its increases in expenditures close to the rate of the increase

vate ern For Public in valuation. Historical analysis of the DMACC budget shows the school's dedication to that principle.

We especially commend you for your sensitivity to the financial constraints placed on today's students while recognizing the full cost of a quality education cannot be paid for by the taxpayer. DMACC offers a fair balance between these two competing interests.

The association would encourage this Board to continue to be alert to opportunities for alternative funding. The college has consistently shown strength in this area. Your use of designated state and federal funds for specific program purposes has been instrumental in bringing successful programs to the campus.

The Association would like to explore in greater detail the possibility of the college's use of a consistent accounting basis for budget and financial documents. Our initial impression is that such a change might make review of the budget more meaningful for groups such as ours. I understand a dialog has already begun on that issue.

As always we appreciate the professionalism of the DMACC's administrative staff and we will work to maintain the open cordial relationship between the college and our Association. I am grateful for the time and attention you have given me and appreciate the time you and members of your staff have spent with our staff and board members. Thank you for the opportunity to comment this afternoon.




