RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR AND ESTABLISHING A SELF-INSURANCE PROGRAM FOR DES MOINES AREA COMMUNITY COLLEGE, RESTRICTING MONEYS FOR PURPOSES OF THE SELF INSURANCE PROGRAM, AND APPROVING AN AGREEMENT FOR ADMINISTRATION OF THE PROGRAM AND A FORM OF INSURANCE POLICY.

WHEREAS, Des Moines Area Community College (hereinafter referred to as the "College"), of the Counties of Adair, Audubon, Boone, Carroll, Cass, Clarke, Crawford, Dallas, Greene, Guthrie, Hamilton, Hardin, Jasper, Lucas, Madison, Mahaska, Marion, Marshall, Polk, Poweshiek, Shelby, Story and Warren, State of Iowa (the area served by the College being hereinafter referred to as the "Merged Area"), is an area community college and a body politic organized and existing under the laws of the State of Iowa, particularly Chapter 260C of the Code of Iowa, as amended (hereinafter referred to as the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors (the "Board") of the College wishes to provide for and establish a self-insurance program (the "Program") to provide operating equipment protection pursuant to authority granted in Section 296.7 of the Code of Iowa, as amended (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the College has previously approved a levy (the "Self-Insurance Levy") for purposes of providing funding for a self-insurance program under the Act; and

WHEREAS, a proposed Agreement for administration of the Program (the "Agreement") has been submitted by Holmes Murphy & Associates, Inc., an insurance brokerage firm located in Des Moines, Iowa (the "Administrator"), to the College; and

WHEREAS, a proposed Operating Equipment Protection Insurance Policy (the "Policy") for the Program has been has been prepared by the "Administrator and submitted to the College for consideration; and

WHEREAS, the Act provides that the Board of Directors may restrict the use of certain moneys held in connection with reserves for uninsured liability or self-insurance programs; and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of this Board of Directors to adopt the Policy and otherwise provide for a self-insurance program and to approve the Agreement in order to provide for administration of the Program; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors desires to restrict certain funds for purposes of providing for uninsured liabilities and the College's self-insurance program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF DES MOINES AREA COMMUNITY COLLEGE, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That it is in the public interest that public agencies are able to procure insurance in the most efficient and economic manner possible, and the Board has determined that

establishing a self-insurance program for operating equipment protection is in the best interests of the College.

- Section 2. That the Board hereby approves and authorizes the establishment of a self-insurance program for operating equipment protection for the College pursuant to the Act, to be effective as of July 1, 2011, in accordance with the material terms and conditions stated in the Policy and the Agreement as presented to the Board at this meeting.
- Section 3. That the Program is hereby approved as to form and the material terms and conditions stated in the Policy and the Agreement, and the President and Secretary of the Board are hereby authorized and directed to proceed on behalf of the College to establish the Program, to prepare and execute such other contacts and instruments as are necessary or advisable to establish and implement the Program, including the Policy and the Agreement, and to take all other actions as they deem necessary or advisable to effect the establishment of the Program in accordance with the Act. That the Policy and the Agreement are hereby approved in substantially the form presented at this meeting.
- Section 4. That all funds received from the self-insurance levy shall be deposited in a special fund in the general fund of the College (the "Restricted Self-Insurance Fund") to be restricted and used as provided herein. The College does hereby restrict the use of all moneys held in the Restricted Self-Insurance Fund to the specific purposes of the Program in accordance with the terms and provisions of the Policy and the Agreement.
- Section 5. That the Restricted Self-Insurance Fund shall be used only as a reserve for uninsured liability or a self-insurance program in connection with the Program and for no other purpose.
- Section 6. That moneys held in the Restricted Self-Insurance Fund shall be restricted and unavailable for any other purpose until this Board of Directors removes such restriction. The removal shall not be effective until all obligations of the restricted fund have been satisfied or the next fiscal year, whichever occurs later.
- Section 7. That the Board may enter into insurance agreements obligating the College to make payments beyond its current budget year to provide for a self-insurance program in order to protect the College from tort liability, loss of property, environmental hazards, or any other risk associated with the operation of the College and the Program.

OPERATING EQUIPMENT PROTECTION POLICY PROVISIONS

The purpose of this policy is to provide operating equipment protection insurance for Des Moines Area Community College ("Named Insured") consistent with the provisions of Section 296.7 Code of Iowa.

SECTION 1

I. PURPOSE

This section of the policy will reimburse the Named Insured for those direct costs for corrective maintenance the Named Insured incurs in order to maintain, repair or replace the equipment systems as part of this policy section. The insurance applicable will be subject to requirements and limitations shown in this section.

II. PROPERTY COVERED

In consideration of the payment of premium, the self insurance fund ("the Fund") does agree to insure the property for Operating Equipment Protection. The insurance is applicable to property owned, leased or under control of the Insured as Named in the Declarations Page. The term "Property" is interchangeable with the "Equipment Systems", "Equipment" and "Item" wherever they appear in the policy.

III. PROPERTY NOT COVERED

This section of the policy does not cover loss to or loss of money, currency, coin, bullion, precious metals of all kinds and in whatsoever form and articles made therefrom, gems, precious and semi-precious stones, certificates of stock, bonds, coupons, and all other forms of securities, bills of lading, warehouse receipts, checks, drafts, money orders, stamps, Insurance Policies and other negotiables (real or personal) or interest therein, and all other documents, valuables and the like.

IV. PERILS INSURED AGAINST

This section of the policy insures against all perils to equipment subject to the exclusions in Section V.

V. EXCLUSIONS

- A. This section of the policy does not insure against loss, damage or expenses caused directly or indirectly by or resulting from:
 - 1. Those perils generally referred to as Fire, Extended Coverage, Sprinkler Leakage and "All Risk",
 - 2. Gradual deterioration, water or acid fumes inherent in operation of the property insured, but any resulting condition or occurrence which may affect normal operations is covered.
 - 3. a. Hostile or warlike action in time of peace or war, including action in hindering, combating or defending against an actual impending or expected attack, (1) by any government or sovereign power (de jure or de facto), or by any authority maintaining or using military, naval or air forces; or (2) by military, naval or air forces; or (3) by an agent of any such government, power, authority or forces;
 - b. Any weapon or war employing atomic fission or radioactive force whether in time of peace or war;
 - c. Insurrection, rebellion, revolution, civil war, usurped power, or action taken by governmental authority in hindering, combating or defending against such an occurrence, seizure or destruction under quarantine or Customs regulations, confiscation by order of any government or public authority, or risks of contraband or illegal transportation or trade:
 - 4. Nuclear reaction or nuclear radiation or radioactive contamination, all whether controlled or uncontrolled and whether such loss be direct, proximate or remote, or be in whole or in pan caused by, contributed to. or aggravated by the perils(s) insured against in this policy, direct loss by fire resulting from nuclear reaction or nuclear radiation or radioactive contamination is insured against by this policy.
 - 5. Delay, loss of market or loss of income.
 - 6. Costs of improvements or update, overhauls or refurbishments or conditions of obsolescence including recommendations by a vendor as a universal improvement for any reason.
 - 7. The giving or surrendering of money or securities in any exchange or purchase, accounting or arithmetical errors or omissions including miscounting and inventory shortage, and loss of property or loss to property of the Insured as a result of a threat to do damage to the premises or property of the Insured.

- B. Unless a specific endorsement is attached to this section of the policy, this section of the policy does not insure against loss, damage or expense caused directly or indirectly by or resulting from:
 - 1. Flood, sewer back-up, earthquake or earth movement.
 - 2. Pick-Up Tubes, electron guns, laser systems, lights, equalization, repair, or replacement of batteries, battery cells or electrodes.
 - 3. Any dishonest, fraudulent, criminal or deliberate act by an Insured, a partner therein or an officer, director, trustee, or employee thereof, whether acting alone or in collusion with others.

VI. DEDUCTIBLE CLAUSE

As respects any insured loss, the Fund shall be liable only when such loss exceeds the Deductible Amount as specified on the Deductible Endorsement if such endorsement is attached to this section and then only for the excess of the deductible.

VII. LIMIT OF LIABILITY

The Fund's liability for loss covered by the policy shall not exceed the amount(s) shown in the Declarations Page.

VIII. SPECIAL CONDITIONS

- A Territorial Limits: This section of the policy covers only within the limits of the State of Iowa.
- B. Valuation: The Fund shall not be liable beyond the actual retail replacement cost of property at the time any loss or damage occurs and the loss or damage shall be ascertained or estimated on the basis of retail replacement cost of property similar in kind to that insured at the place of, and immediately preceding the time of such loss or damage, but in no event to exceed the amount of insurance for the specified item shown on the Equipment Schedule of Section 1 of the policy, as a Limit of Liability, nor the amount which it would cost to repair or replace the property with material of like kind or quality, whichever is less.
 - 1. The Fund shall not be liable for:
 - a. Any increase in the cost of repair or replacement necessitated by any ordinance or law regulating or restricting repair, alteration, construction or installation.
 - b. Loss or damage to property useless to the Insured or obsolete to the Insured.
 - c. Rental of substitute equipment beyond a forty-five (45) day period and the total reimbursement for the total rental charges and necessary repairs shall not exceed the amount of insurance for a replacement item of equal value, as a Limit of Liability.
 - 2. If any damaged property is not repaired or replaced, the Fund's liability as respects such property shall be limited to its actual cash value with proper deduction for wear and tear.

- 3. The Fund agrees that the Insured may substitute property of a similar kind, but of improved or better quality, if replacement of an item is necessary, for the property insured by this policy if such property is lost or damaged by an insured peril. However, nothing in this paragraph shall be deemed to increase the Fund's liability as specified elsewhere in this section of the policy and in no event shall the liability exceed the Limit of Liability for the item as shown in Section 1 of the policy.
- C. Impairment of Recovery Rights: Any act or agreement by the Insured after loss or damage whereby any right of the Insured to recover in whole or in part for the loss or damage to property covered hereunder against any carrier, bailee or other party liable therefore, is released, impaired or lost, shall render this section of the policy null and void but the Fund's right to retain or recover the premium shall not be affected. The Fund is not liable for any loss or damage which, without its written consent, has been settled or compromised by the Insured. It shall, however, be permissible for the Insured, without prejudice to this insurance, to accept the ordinary Bills of Lading or Shipping Receipts issued by carriers limiting their liability to less than the actual value.
- D. Fund's Options: It shall be optional with the Fund to take all, or any part, of the property at the agreed or appraised value, or to repair, rebuild or replace the property destroyed or damaged with other of like kind and quality within a reasonable time, on giving notice of its intention to do so within thirty (30) days after the receipt of the proof of loss herein required.
- E. Abandonment: There can be no abandonment to the Fund of any property.
- F. Assignment of Policy: This section of the policy shall be void if assigned or transferred without the written consent of the Fund.
- G. Cancellation: The policy may be cancelled by the Insured by surrender thereof to the Fund or by mailing to the Fund written notice stating when thereafter such cancellation shall be effective. The policy may be cancelled by the Fund, by mailing to the Insured at the address shown in the policy or last known address a written notice stating when, not less than thirty (30) days thereafter, such cancellation shall be effective. The mailing of notice as aforesaid shall be sufficient proof of the notice. The time of surrender or the effective date of the cancellation stated in the notice shall become the end of the policy period. Delivery of such written notice either by the Insured or by the Fund shall be equivalent to mailing.
- H. Coinsurance: The Fund shall be liable in event of loss for no greater proportion thereof than the limit of liability as shown on the Equipment Schedule bears to the replacement cost (as determined by the valuation clause contained in this section of the policy) of the property insured hereunder at the time of loss unless the Agreed Amount Endorsement is attached to Section 1 of the policy. If this section of the policy covers two or more items, this condition applies to each item separately.

- I. Other Insurance: This section of the policy shall not be liable for those losses covered by any other valid and collectible insurance covering the same equipment.
- J. Examination of Records: The Insured shall, as often as may be reasonably required during the term of the policy and for one year thereafter, produce for examination by the Fund or its duly authorized representative all books and records, inventories and accounts relating to the property covered hereunder.
- K Inspection: The Fund or its representative shall be permitted but not obligated to inspect, at all reasonable times, any property designated and described as insured Equipment. Neither the Fund's right to make inspections nor the making thereof nor any report thereon shall constitute an undertaking on behalf of or for the benefit of the Named Insured or others to determine or warrant that such property is safe and healthful.
- L. Warranties: This insurance shall not apply to any loss or damage to any insured property to the extent that such loss or damage is covered under any warranty, guarantee or service contract.
- M. Any part of this section of the policy that conflicts with state law is automatically changed to conform to the law. Also, this form supersedes the general conditions form wherever at conflict therewith.

WHEREAS, Des Moines Area Community College (hereinafter referred to as the "College"), is an area community college and a body politic organized and existing under the laws of the State of Iowa, and is authorized and empowered by Chapter 260F of the Code of Iowa, as amended (hereinafter referred to as the "Act"), to provide a "Jobs Training Program" as that term is defined in the Act, including the program costs, the purpose of which is to provide retraining of existing workers for a business within the State of Iowa (the "State") in order to improve the economic welfare of the residents of the State, and is authorized under the Act to pay the costs of such a program from funds allocated for such purpose by the Iowa Department of Economic Development under Section 260F.6 of the Act; and

WHEREAS, the College has undertaken negotiations with respect to a Jobs Training Program with Syngenta Seeds, Inc. (the "Company"), pursuant to the provisions of the Act for the purpose of establishing a jobs training program (hereinafter referred to as the "Project") to retrain workers at the Company at its facilities located in the merged area served by the College, which Project will be beneficial to the Company and the College; and

WHEREAS, the College has received an allocation (the "Fund Advance") under Section 260F.6 of the Act in order to defray all or a portion of the cost of the Project, including necessary expenses incidental thereto, in the amount of \$25,000; and

WHEREAS, a Retraining Agreement, in the form and with the contents set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto, has been negotiated by the College under the terms of which the College agrees, subject to the provisions of such Agreement, to provide a Jobs Training Program for the Company;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF DES MOINES AREA COMMUNITY COLLEGE, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. IOWA JOBS TRAINING PROGRAM (260F) TRAINING CONTRACT

This Iowa Jobs Training Program TRAINING CONTRACT (the "Contract"), effective as of May 9, 2011 between Des Moines Area Community College, Ankeny, Iowa, (the "Community College" and its location), and Syngenta Seeds, Inc., Ames, Iowa, (the "Employer" and its location), is entered into under the following circumstances:

- A. Pursuant to Chapter 260F of the Code of Iowa (the "Act"), the Community College enters into this Contract with the Employer for purposes of establishing a training program to educate and train certain persons employed by the Employer.
- B. The Community College and the Employer each have full right and lawful authority to enter into this Contract and to perform and monitor the provisions of this Contract as they apply respectively to the Community College and the Employer.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual representations and agreements herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

ARTICLE I REPRESENTATIONS

- Section 1.1. Representations of the Community College. The Community College represents and covenants that:
 - (A) It is duly organized and validly existing under the laws of the State of Iowa;
 - (B) It is not in violation of or in conflict with any provisions of the laws of the State, which would impair its ability to carry out its obligations hereunder;
 - (C) It is empowered to enter into the transactions contemplated by this Contract; and
 - (D) It will do all things in its power required to maintain its existence or assure the assumption of its obligations hereunder by any successor public body.
- Section 1.2. <u>Representations and Covenants of the Employer</u>. The Employer represents and covenants that:
 - (A) It is a business duly qualified to do business in Iowa;
 - (B) It has full power to execute, deliver, and perform this Contract and all other instruments given by the Employer to secure its performance and to enter into and carry out the transactions contemplated herein. Such execution, delivery, and performance are not in contravention of law or the Employer's articles of incorporation, by-laws or any indenture, agreement, mortgage, lease, undertaking, or any other restriction, obligation or instrument to which the Employer is a party or by which it is bound.

This Contract has by proper action been duly authorized, executed, and delivered by the Employer and all steps necessary have been taken to constitute this Contract as a valid and binding obligation of the Employer.

- (C) There is no threatened, pending, or actual litigation or proceeding against the Employer or any other person which affects, in any manner whatsoever, the right of the Employer to execute the Contract or to otherwise comply with its obligations contained in the Contract.
- (D) The Employer is engaged in interstate or intrastate commerce for the purpose of manufacturing, processing, or assembling products or conducting research and development; OR, provides services and has customers outside of Iowa.
- (E) The employer, within the 36 month period prior to the date of this application, did not close or reduce its employment base by more than 20 percent at any of its other business sites in Iowa in order to relocate substantially the same operation to another area of the state.
- (F) The employer is not currently involved in a strike, lockout, or other labor dispute at any of its business sites in Iowa.
- (G) Persons to receive training under this Contract are current employees of the employer for which the employer pays state withholding tax.
- (H) Employees to receive training are not replacement workers who were hired as a result of a strike, lockout, or other labor dispute.
- (I) The employer is an equal opportunity employer which complies with all local, state, and federal affirmative action requirements.

ARTICLE II PROJECT; PROGRAM SERVICES; FEES

- Section 2.1 The Iowa Jobs Training Program (260F) Application for Assistance, as submitted by the Community College in behalf of the Employer, and as approved by the Iowa Department of Economic Development, shall be incorporated as an integral part of this Contract. The "Project", as defined by the Application, shall consist of the program services and costs of services to be provided, the number of employees to be trained, the beginning and ending dates of training, the stated budget, and any other provisions specified in the Application.
- Section 2.2. The Community College agrees to provide the program services within the constraints of funds awarded and released to the Project by the Department of Economic Development. It is understood and agreed that the Employer and the Community College will cooperate in the coordination and programming of the specific expenditures and operation of the Project within the guidelines set out by the approved application.
- Section 2.3. Iowa Code section 84A.5 requires the Department of Economic Development to report to the Iowa General Assembly the impact of training provided by this Program on the wages of employees who receive training. This information is obtained by matching social security numbers of trainees with State income records. The Employer therefore agrees to provide the social security number of each employee who receives training under this contract.

- Section 2.4. The Employer agrees to complete Performance Report, Form 260F-5, at the completion of training to evaluate the initial impact of training on the Business' operations. The Employer also agrees to complete a follow-preport one year after the completion of training to determine whether the Business' initial objectives for training were met.
- Section 2.5. It is understood by the Community College and the Employer that should project funds not be available or received from the Department of Economic Development within a reasonable period of time, this Contract shall be terminated by mutual agreement of the parties. In any event, the Employer shall pay all administrative and legal costs associated with this Project which have been incurred by the Community College.

ARTICLE III PAYMENT AND SECURITY

- Section 3.1. The Community College shall create a fund to deposit monies awarded to the Project by the Department of Economic Development (DED). Funds awarded by DED shall be known as the Project Award. Interest earned on the fund shall be refunded to the State if not used by the Community College in accordance with Iowa Administrative Code Chapter 261.
- Section 3.2. The Employer and the Community College agree that the Project Award, in the amount of \$25,000.00, is issued by DED as a forgivable loan and shall not be required to be repaid by the Employer unless an event of default has occurred. Events of default and associated penalties are specified in Article VI of this Contract. The Community College and the Department of Economic Development shall determine whether an event of default has occurred.

ARTICLE IV CONTRACT MODIFICATION

- Section 4.1. An Employer shall not modify any provision of this Contract without the prior written approval of the Community College.
- Section 4.2 The Community College, with the written consent of the Employer, has the authority to modify all provisions of this Contract **except** modifications which result in a reduction of the number of employees to be trained or which significantly change the training program. The Community College is authorized to change the ending dates of the training project, training provider, or other minor modifications to the training program. A signed copy of the modification must be sent to the Department.
- Section 4.3 Modifications which result in a reduction of the number of employees to be trained or change the training program content must by approved by the Department of Economic Development, the Community College, and the Employer.
- Section 4.4 This Contract shall not be modified in any way that would result in a violation of the "Act".

ARTICLE V EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY/AFFIRMATIVE ACTION REQUIREMENTS

- Section 5.1. The employer shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws, rules, and executive orders, to insure that no applicant for employment or employee is discriminated against because of race, religion, color, age, sex, national origin, or disability.
- Section 5.2. The employer shall provide state or federal agencies with appropriate reports as required to insure compliance with equal employment opportunity laws and regulations.
- Section 5.3. The employer shall insure, to the maximum extent possible, that all authorized subcontractors comply with provisions of this section.

ARTICLE VI EVENTS OF DEFAULT

- Section 6.1. Events of Default. Each of the following shall be an "event of default":
 - (A) The Employer fails to complete the training project within the agreed period of time as specified in the training Contract. Such Employer shall be required to repay 20 percent of total project funds expended by the community college and the business.
 - (B) The Employer fails to train the agreed number of employees as specified in the training Contract. Such Employer shall be required to repay a proportionate amount of total project funds expended by the community college and the Employer. The proportion shall be based on the number of employees not trained compared to the number of employees to have been trained.
 - (C) If both (A) and (B) occur, both penalties shall apply.
 - (D) The Employer fails to comply with any requirements contained in the training agreement. The Employer shall be sent written notice by the community college, which specifies the issue(s) of noncompliance and shall be allowed 20 days from the date notice is sent to effect a cure. If noncompliance is of such a nature that a cure cannot be reasonably accomplished within 20 days, the community college has the discretion to extend the period of cure to a maximum of 60 days.
 - (E) The Employer ceases or announces the cessation of operations at the project site prior to completion of the training program.
 - (F) The Employer directly or indirectly makes any false or misleading representations or warranties in the program application or training agreement, reports, or any other documents, which are provided, to the community college or the department.
 - (G) The Employer acts in any manner contrary to, or fails to act in accordance with any provision of the training Contract.
 - (H) An Employer takes corporate action to effect any of the preceding conditions of default.

- Section 6.2. Whenever an event of default has occurred, further training or payments to the Employer shall be suspended.
- Section 6.3. Whenever an event of default has occurred for reasons cited in ARTICLE VI, Section 6.1. (A-C), the Employer shall immediately pay to the Department of Economic Development the amount of penalty determined by the Department. The Employer shall also pay interest on the amount to be repaid at the rate of $\underline{6}\%$. Interest shall accrue from the issuance date specified on the Project Award check.
- Section 6.4 Whenever an event of default has occurred for reasons cited in ARTICLE VI, Section 6.1. (D-H), the Employer shall immediately pay to the Department of Economic Development the amount expended by the Employer and the Community College from the Project Award. The Employer shall also pay interest on the amount to be repaid at the rate of 6%. Interest shall accrue from the issuance date specified on the Project Award check.
- Section 6.5. Whenever an event of default has occurred and is continuing, the Community College may take whatever action at law or in equity may appear necessary or desirable to collect the amounts then due or to enforce performance and observance of any other obligation or agreement of the Employer under this Contract.
- Section 6.6. No remedy conferred upon or reserved to the Community College by this Contract is intended to be exclusive of any other available remedy or remedies, but each and every such remedy shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to every other remedy now or hereafter existing at law, in equity or by statute. No delay or omission to exercise any right or power accruing upon any default shall impair any such right or power or shall be construed to be a waiver thereof, but any such right and power may be exercised from time to time and as often as may be deemed expedient. In order to entitle the Community College to exercise any remedy reserved to it in this Article, shall not be necessary to give any notice, other then such notice as may be expressly required herein.
- Section 6.7. In the event any agreement contained in this Contract should be breached by either party and thereafter waived by the other party, such waiver shall be limited to the particular breach so waived and shall not be deemed to waive any other breach hereunder.
- Section 6.8. As required by Iowa Administrative Code, Chapter F, any payments required to be made by the Employer to the Department of Economic Development are a lien upon the Employer's property until paid and have equal precedence with ordinary taxes and shall not be divested by a judicial sale. Property subject to the lien may be sold for sums due and delinquent at a tax sale, with the same forfeitures, penalties, and consequences as for the nonpayment of ordinary taxes. The purchaser at tax sale obtains the property subject to the remaining payments.
- Section 6.9. Whenever an event of default has occurred and is unresolved, the Community College shall assign this Contract to the Iowa Department of Economic Development for appropriate collection action.

ARTICLE VII MISCELLANEOUS

Section 7.1. All notices, requests or other communications hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to be sufficiently given when mailed by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, addressed to the appropriate address as follows:

The Employer and the Community College may, by notice given hereunder, designate any further or different addresses to which subsequent notices, requests or other communications shall be sent.

- Section 7.2. All covenants, stipulations, obligations and agreements of the Community College contained in this Contract shall be effective to the extent authorized and permitted by applicable law. No such covenant, stipulation, obligation or agreement shall be deemed to be a covenant, stipulation, obligation or agreement of any present or future member, officer, agent or employee of the Community College or the Board of Directors other than in his official capacity, and neither the members of the Board of Directors nor any official executing this Contract shall be liable personally or be subject to any personal liability or accountability by reason of the covenants, stipulations, obligations or agreements of the Community College contained in this Contract.
- Section 7.3. This Contract shall benefit of and be binding in accordance with its terms upon the Community College, the Employer and their respective permitted successors and assigns. This Contract may not be assigned by the Employer without the express written consent of the Community College and may not be assigned by the Community College except as may be necessary to enforce or secure payment due resulting from an event of default.
- Section 7.4. This Contract may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be regarded as an original and all of which shall constitute but one and the same instrument.
- Section 7.5. If any provision of this Contract, or any covenant, stipulation, obligation, agreement, act, or action, or part thereof made, assumed, entered into or taken thereunder or any application thereof, is for any reason held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provision or any other covenant, stipulation, obligation, agreement, act or action or part thereof, made, assumed, entered into, or taken, each of which shall be onstrued and enforced as if such illegal or invalid portion were not contained herein. Nor shall illegality of any application thereof affect any legal and valid application thereof, and each such provision, covenant, stipulation,

obligation, agreement, act, or action, or part thereof shall be deemed to be effective, operative, made, entered into or taken in the manner and to the full extent permitted by law.

Section 7.6. This Contract shall be governed exclusively by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Iowa.

WHEREAS, the College has undertaken negotiations with respect to a Jobs Training Program with LifeServe Blood Center (the "Company"), pursuant to the provisions of the Act for the purpose of establishing a jobs training program (hereinafter referred to as the "Project") to retrain workers at the Company at its facilities located in the merged area served by the College, which Project will be beneficial to the Company and the College; and

WHEREAS, the IDED has approved an application by the College for Grow Iowa Values Funds in order to defray all or a portion of the cost of the Project, including necessary expenses incidental thereto, in the amount of \$25,000; and

WHEREAS, an Iowa Values Fund Training Contract, in the form and with the contents set forth in Exhibit "A" attached hereto, has been negotiated by the College under the terms of which the College agrees, subject to the provisions of such Contract, to provide a Jobs Training Program for the Company;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF DES MOINES AREA COMMUNITY COLLEGE, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. GROW IOWA VALUES FUND TRAINING CONTRACT

This Grow Iowa Values Fund TRAINING CONTRACT (the "Contract"), effective as of <u>May 9, 2011</u> between <u>Des Moines Area Community College</u>, <u>Ankeny, Iowa</u>, (the "Community College" and its location), and <u>LifeServe Blood Center</u>, <u>Des Moines</u>, <u>Iowa</u>, (the "Employer" and its location), is entered into under the following circumstances:

- A. Pursuant to Chapter 260F of the Code of Iowa (the "Act"), the Community College enters into this Contract with the Employer for purposes of establishing a training program to educate and train certain persons employed by the Employer.
- B. The Community College and the Employer each have full right and lawful authority to enter into this Contract and to perform and monitor the provisions of this Contract as they apply respectively to the Community College and the Employer.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual representations and agreements herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

ARTICLE I REPRESENTATIONS

- Section 1.1. Representations of the Community College. The Community College represents and covenants that:
 - (A) It is duly organized and validly existing under the laws of the State of Iowa;
 - (B) It is not in violation of or in conflict with any provisions of the laws of the State, which would impair its ability to carry out its obligations hereunder;
 - (C) It is empowered to enter into the transactions contemplated by this Contract; and
 - (D) It will do all things in its power required to maintain its existence or assure the assumption of its obligations hereunder by any successor public body.
- Section 1.2. <u>Representations and Covenants of the Employer</u>. The Employer represents and covenants that:
 - (A) It is a business duly qualified to do business in Iowa;
 - (B) It has full power to execute, deliver, and perform this Contract and all other instruments given by the Employer to secure its performance and to enter into and carry out the transactions contemplated herein. Such execution, delivery, and performance are not in contravention of law or the Employer's articles of incorporation, by-laws or any indenture, agreement, mortgage, lease, undertaking, or any other restriction, obligation or instrument to which the Employer is a party or by which it is bound. This Contract has by proper action been duly authorized, executed, and delivered by the Employer and all steps necessary have been taken to constitute this Contract as a valid and binding obligation of the Employer.

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- (C) There is no threatened, pending, or actual litigation or proceeding against the Employer or any other person which affects, in any manner whatsoever, the right of the Employer to execute the Contract or to otherwise comply with its obligations contained in the Contract.
- (D) The Employer is engaged in interstate or intrastate commerce for the purpose of manufacturing, processing, or assembling products or conducting research and development; OR, provides services and has customers outside of Iowa.
- (E) The employer, within the 36 month period prior to the date of this application, did not close or reduce its employment base by more than 20 percent at any of its other business sites in Iowa in order to relocate substantially the same operation to another area of the state.
- (F) The employer is not currently involved in a strike, lockout, or other labor dispute at any of its business sites in Iowa.
- (G) Persons to receive training under this Contract are current employees of the employer for which the employer pays state withholding tax.
- (H) Employees to receive training are not replacement workers who were hired as a result of a strike, lockout, or other labor dispute.
- (I) The employer is an equal opportunity employer which complies with all local, state, and federal affirmative action requirements.

ARTICLE II PROJECT; PROGRAM SERVICES; FEES

- Section 2.1 The Iowa Jobs Training Program (260F) Application for Assistance, as submitted by the Community College in behalf of the Employer, and as approved by the Iowa Department of Economic Development, shall be incorporated as an integral part of this Contract. The "Project", as defined by the Application, shall consist of the program services and costs of services to be provided, the number of employees to be trained, the beginning and ending dates of training, the stated budget, and any other provisions specified in the Application.
- Section 2.2. The Community College agrees to provide the program services within the constraints of funds awarded and released to the Project by the Department of Economic Development. It is understood and agreed that the Employer and the Community College will cooperate in the coordination and programming of the specific expenditures and operation of the Project within the guidelines set out by the approved application.
- Section 2.3. Iowa Code section 84A.5 requires the Department of Economic Development to report to the Iowa General Assembly the impact of training provided by this Program on the wages of employees who receive training. This information is obtained by matching social security numbers of trainees with State income records. The Employer therefore agrees to provide the social security number of each employee who receives training under this contract.
- Section 2.4. The Business also agrees to complete a follow-up report one year after the completion of training to determine whether the Business' initial objectives for training were met.

Section 2.5. It is understood by the Community College and the Employer that should project funds not be available or received from the Department of Economic Development within a reasonable period of time, this ontract shall be terminated by mutual agreement of the parties. In any event, the Employer shall pay all administrative and legal costs associated with this Project which have been incurred by the Community College.

ARTICLE III PAYMENT AND SECURITY

- Section 3.1. The Community College shall create a fund to deposit monies awarded to the Project by the Department of Economic Development (DED). Funds awarded by DED shall be known as the Project Award. Interest earned on the fund shall be refunded to the State if not used by the Community College in accordance with Iowa Administrative Code Chapter 261.
- Section 3.2. The Employer and the Community College agree that the Project Award, in the amount of \$25,000.00, is issued by DED as a forgivable loan and shall not be required to be repaid by the Employer unless an event of default has occurred. Events of default and associated penalties are specified in Article VI of this Contract. The Community College and the Department of Economic Development shall determine whether an event of default has occurred.

ARTICLE IV CONTRACT MODIFICATION

- Section 4.1. The Employer shall not modify any provision of this Contract without the prior written approval of the Community College.
- Section 4.2 The Community College, with the written consent of the Employer, has the authority to modify all provisions of this Contract **except** modifications which result in a reduction of the number of employees to be trained or which significantly change the training program. The Community College is authorized to change the ending dates of the training project, training provider, or other minor modifications to the training program. A signed copy of the modification must be sent to the Department.
- Section 4.3 Modifications which result in a reduction of the number of employees to be trained or change the training program content must by approved by the Department of Economic Development, the Community College, and the Employer.
- Section 4.4 This Contract shall not be modified in any way that would result in a violation of the "Act".

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ARTICLE V EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY/AFFIRMATIVE ACTION REQUIREMENTS

- Section 5.1. The employer shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws, rules, and executive orders, to insure that no applicant for employment or employee is discriminated against because of race, religion, color, age, sex, national origin, or disability.
- Section 5.2. The employer shall provide state or federal agencies with appropriate reports as required to insure compliance with equal employment opportunity laws and regulations.
- Section 5.3. The employer shall insure, to the maximum extent possible, that all authorized subcontractors comply with provisions of this section.

ARTICLE VI EVENTS OF DEFAULT

- Section 6.1. Events of Default. Each of the following shall be an "event of default":
 - (A) The Employer fails to complete the training project within the agreed period of time as specified in the training Contract. Such Employer shall be required to repay 20 percent of total project funds expended by the community college and the business.
 - (B) The Employer fails to train the agreed number of employees as specified in the training Contract. Such Employer shall be required to repay a proportionate amount of total project funds expended by the community college and the Employer. The proportion shall be based on the number of employees not trained compared to the number of employees to have been trained.
 - (C) If both (A) and (B) occur, both penalties shall apply.
 - (D) The Employer fails to comply with any requirements contained in the training agreement. The Employer shall be sent written notice by the community college, which specifies the issue(s) of noncompliance and shall be allowed 20 days from the date notice is sent to effect a cure. If noncompliance is of such a nature that a cure cannot be reasonably accomplished within 20 days, the community college has the discretion to extend the period of cure to a maximum of 60 days.
 - (E) The Employer ceases or announces the cessation of operations at the project site prior to completion of the training program.
 - (F) The Employer directly or indirectly makes any false or misleading representations or warranties in the program application or training agreement, reports, or any other documents, which are provided, to the community college or the department.
 - (G) The Employer acts in any manner contrary to, or fails to act in accordance with any provision of the training Contract.
 - (H) The Employer takes corporate action to effect any of the preceding conditions of default.
- Lection 6.2. Whenever an event of default has occurred, further training or payments to the Employer shall be suspended.

- Section 6.3. Whenever an event of default has occurred for reasons cited in ARTICLE VI, Section 6.1. (A-C), the imployer shall immediately pay to the Department of Economic Development the amount of penalty determined by the Department. The Employer shall also pay interest on the amount to be repaid at the rate of $\underline{6}\%$. Interest shall accrue from the issuance date specified on the Project Award check.
- Section 6.4 Whenever an event of default has occurred for reasons cited in ARTICLE VI, Section 6.1. (D-H), the Employer shall immediately pay to the Department of Economic Development the amount expended by the Employer and the Community College from the Project Award. The Employer shall also pay interest on the amount to be repaid at the rate of 6%. Interest shall accrue from the issuance date specified on the Project Award check.
- Section 6.5. Whenever an event of default has occurred and is continuing, the Community College may take whatever action at law or in equity may appear necessary or desirable to collect the amounts then due or to enforce performance and observance of any other obligation or agreement of the Employer under this Contract.
- Section 6.6. No remedy conferred upon or reserved to the Community College by this Contract is intended to be exclusive of any other available remedy or remedies, but each and every such remedy shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to every other remedy now or hereafter existing at law, in equity or by statute. No delay or omission to exercise any right or power accruing upon any default shall impair any such right or power or shall be construed to be a waiver thereof, but any such right and power may be exercised from time to time and as often as may be deemed expedient. In order to entitle the Community College to exercise any remedy reserved to it in this Article, it shall not be necessary to give any notice, other then such notice as may be expressly required herein.
- ection 6.7. In the event any agreement contained in this Contract should be breached by either party and thereafter waived by the other party, such waiver shall be limited to the particular breach so waived and shall not be deemed to waive any other breach hereunder.
- Section 6.8. As required by Iowa Administrative Code, Chapter F, any payments required to be made by the Employer to the Department of Economic Development are a lien upon the Employer's property until paid and have equal precedence with ordinary taxes and shall not be divested by a judicial sale. Property subject to the lien may be sold for sums due and delinquent at a tax sale, with the same forfeitures, penalties, and consequences as for the nonpayment of ordinary taxes. The purchaser at tax sale obtains the property subject to the remaining payments.
- Section 6.9. Whenever an event of default has occurred and is unresolved, the Community College shall assign this Contract to the Iowa Department of Economic Development for appropriate collection action.

Section 7.1. All notices, requests or other communications hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to be fficiently given when mailed by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, addressed to the appropriate address as follows:

- Section 7.4. This Contract may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be regarded as an original and all of which shall constitute but one and the same instrument.
- Section 7.5. If any provision of this Contract, or any covenant, stipulation, obligation, agreement, act, or action, or part thereof made, assumed, entered into or taken thereunder or any application thereof, is for any reason held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provision or any other covenant, stipulation, obligation, agreement, act or action or part thereof, made, assumed, entered into, or taken, each of which shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal or invalid portion were not contained herein. Nor shall illegality of any application thereof affect any legal and valid application thereof, and each such provision, covenant, stipulation, obligation, agreement, act, or action, or part thereof shall be deemed to be effective, operative, made, entered into or taken in the manner and to the full extent permitted by law.

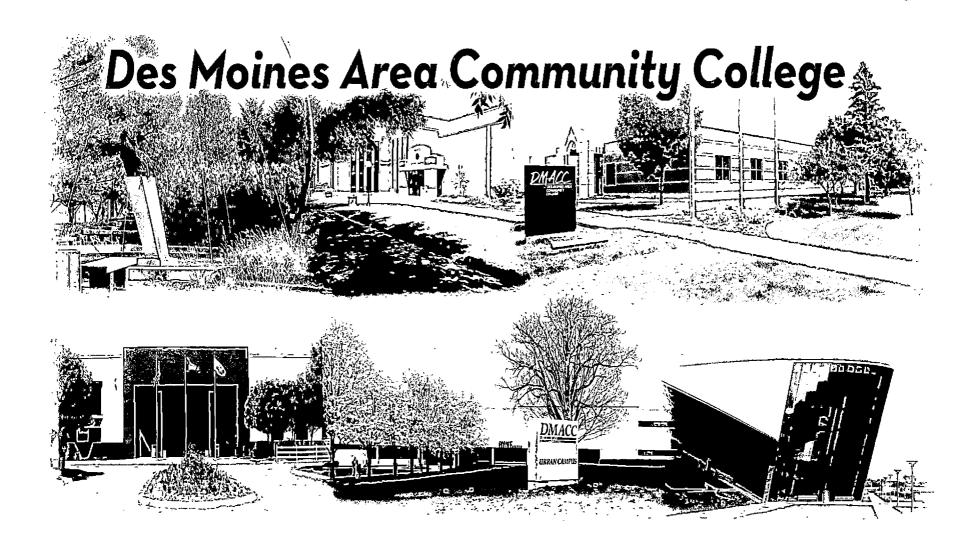

DMACC Fund Descriptions

Fund 1 - General Unrestricted Fund

This fund is used to account for the general operations of the College. These funds are available for any legally authorized purpose and are, therefore, used to account for all revenue and expenditures for activities not provided for in other funds. The organizational units to be financed through this fund are those which are generally directly concerned with the operation and support of the educational programs of the College as a whole.

Fund 2 - General Restricted Fund

This fund is used to account for resources that are available for the operation and support of the educational programs, but are restricted as to their use by outside agencies or donors.

Fund 3 - Auxiliary Fund

These funds are unrestricted, but they have been designated for a particular use. They account for activities intended primarily to provide non-instructional services or sales to students, staff, and/or institutional departments, and which are in addition to the educational and general objectives of the College.

Fund 4 - Agency Fund

This fund is used to account for assets held by the College as custodian or fiscal agent for others.

Fund 5 - Scholarship Fund

This fund accounts for the receipt and disbursement of scholarship awards to students, primarily PELL grants.

Fund 6 - Loan Fund

This fund accounts for the receipt and disbursement of funds relating to student loans.

Fund 7 - Plant Fund

This fund is used to account for transactions relating to investment in College properties. They include amounts which have been appropriated or designated for purchase of land, improvements, buildings, and equipment, the retirement of indebtedness and the administration of the physical plant.

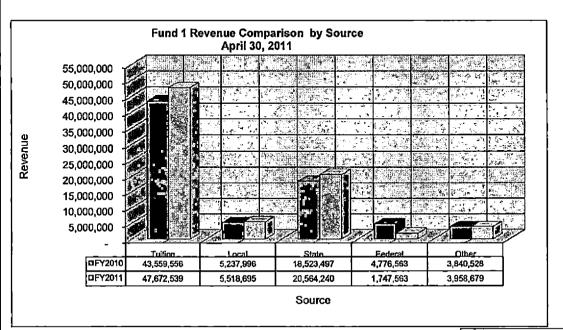

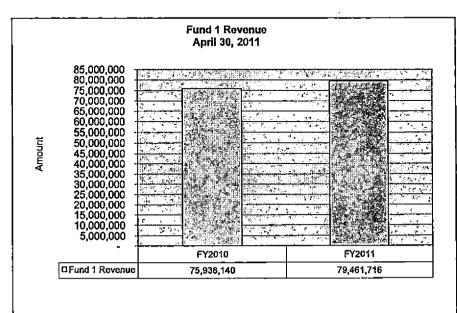

Des Moines Area Community College Revenue Comparison With Prior Year For The Ten Months Ended April 30, 2011

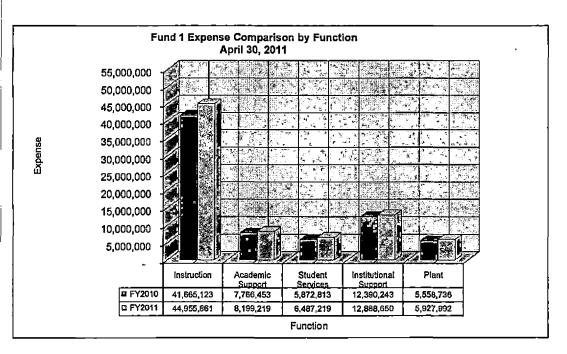


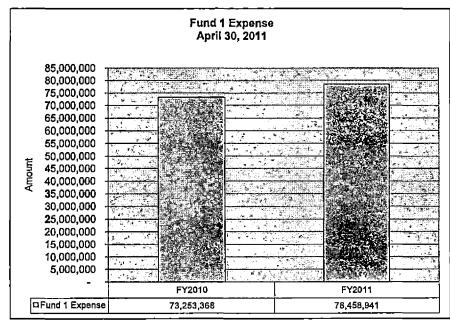
