Since an official quorum was not present to legally conduct business at this meeting, the canvassing of votes was deferred to be a matter of business at the next regular meeting.

**ORGANIZATION** A special meeting of the Area XI Community College Board of Directors was called for Monday, October 7, 1968 at 7:30 P.M., as specified by law, for the purpose of organizing the Board. Since an official quorum was not present to legally conduct business at this meeting, organizing the Board was deferred to be a matter of business at the next regular meeting.

RESOLUTION APPROVING PLANS, SPECIFICATIONS, AND  
FORM OF CONTRACT

WHEREAS, on the 25th day of September, 1968, plans, specifications, and form of contract were filed with the Secretary of the Board of Directors of the Area Community College Merged Area (Education) XI in the counties of Boone, Dallas, Jasper, Madison, Marion, Polk, Story and Warren, State of Iowa, with the exclusion of the Bayard Community School District, State of Iowa, for the construction of Phasing Campus Walkways and Finish Grading, and,

WHEREAS, notice of hearing on plans, specifications and form of contract was published as required by law and action of this Board:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE AREA COMMUNITY COLLEGE MERGED AREA (EDUCATION) XI IN THE COUNTIES OF BOONE, DALLAS, JASPER, MADISON, MARION, POLK, STORY AND WARREN, STATE OF IOWA, TOGETHER WITH THE COUNTY SCHOOL SYSTEM OF GUTHRIE COUNTY, STATE OF IOWA, WITH THE EXCLUSION OF THE BAYARD COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT, STATE OF IOWA:

That said plans, specifications, and form of lease are hereby approved and adopted as the plans, specifications and form of contract for the construction of Phasing Campus Walkways and Finish Grading.

The canvass of votes having indicated the election as Directors on the Area XI Community College Board of Robert Lounsberry, Ross Cramlet, and Harry Bloomquist, the Vice President of the Board administered the Oath of Office to Ross Cramlet and Harry Bloomquist. It was noted that the Oath of Office had previously been administered to Robert Lounsberry by a qualified person and that such Oath was properly verified by the administering officer and filed with the Secretary of the Board.

**ELECTION OF BOARD PRESIDENT** Nominations were open for President of the Area XI Community College Board of Directors. M. Kreager nominated Rolland Grefe as President of the Board and moved that nominations cease and that Rolland Grefe be unanimously elected as President. D. Mater seconded the motion. Motion passed and Rolland Grefe was unanimously elected President of the Board.

**ELECTION OF BOARD VICE PRESIDENT** Nominations were open for Vice President of the Area XI Community College Board of Directors. H. Bloomquist nominated Max Kreager for Vice President of the Area XI Community College Board and moved that nominations cease and that Max Kreager be unanimously elected as Vice President. W. Price seconded the motion. Motion passed and Max Kreager was unanimously elected Vice President of the Board.

**OATH OF OFFICE TO NEWLY ELECTED BOARD OFFICERS** The Oath of Office was administered by the Board Secretary to Rolland Grefe and Max Kreager, the newly elected President and Vice President respectively.

**APPOINTMENT OF BOARD SECRETARY AND TREASURER** A motion was made by D. Mater, seconded by R. Cramlet that Irv Steinberg be reappointed as Board Secretary and that Noel J. Liechty be reappointed as Board Treasurer. Motion passed.

**PROGRESS REPORT ON CAMPUS CONSTRUCTION** Mr. Clifford Prall and Mr. Amos Emery gave a brief progress report as to the construction status of the Phasing Campus. Discussion was also held relative to the status of Phase I of the Building Program. It was stated that about two weeks work remained on completion of the Phase I project drawings.

With the agreement of the architects, Board President R. Grefe called for a special board meeting to be held on Monday, October 28, 1968, at 7:30 P.M., location to be designated at a later date, for the purpose of reviewing the architect's drawings and layout of the Phase I project.

**PERSONNEL** A motion was made by H. Welin, seconded by R. Cramlet that employment be offered to the following applicants in accordance with Superintendent Lowery's recommendation as indicated:

**ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS** Superintendent Lowery briefly reviewed the Beckes Report.

It was noted that the job offer made to Stanley Peterson for the position of Coordinator, Vocational-Technical Education was not accepted.

- CORRESPONDENCE** Superintendent Lowery stated that correspondence had been received relative to the Attorney General's opinion on legalizing act. In essence, area schools have been declared legalized.
- BOONE JUNIOR COLLEGE CONTRACT** Discussion was held relative to the dissatisfaction by the Boone Community Board of Directors to the proposed operating agreement for 1968-69 previously approved by the Area XI Board. The dissatisfaction was stated as being due to the enrollment limitation of 358 students which was specified in the agreement.
- A motion was made by M. Kreager, seconded by D. Mater that the enrollment limitation be deleted from the agreement presented to the Boone Junior College for operation for the 1968-69 school year. Motion passed.
- STEERING COMMITTEE** President R. Grefe stated that the Steering Committee has been redesignated as the Iowa Council of Area Schools. The next regular meeting of this Council was noted as being October 26, 1968 at 9:30 A.M. at Fort Dodge, Iowa.
- A motion was made by H. Bloomquist, seconded by H. Welin that Max Kreager be appointed as the Area XI Board's representative to the Iowa Council of Area Schools. Motion passed.
- CLAIMS AND ACCOUNTS** A motion was made by D. Mater, seconded by R. Cramlet that the Claims and Accounts as presented, with exceptions noted, be approved. Motion passed.
- APPROVAL OF EXPENSE ACCOUNT POLICY** Superintendent Lowery presented an expense account policy statement for the board's review and approval.
- A motion was made by H. Welin, seconded by M. Kreager that the expense account policy be approved in the form submitted. Motion passed.
- SCHOOL NAME** A listing of suggested school names in lieu of the Area XI designation was reviewed. Action on selection of a school name was deferred until the next regular school board meeting.
- APPROVAL OF MANPOWER ADVISORY COMMITTEES** A motion was made by M. Kreager, seconded by H. Bloomquist that the Manpower Advisory Committees be approved as presented. Motion passed.
- ADULT EDUCATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE** A listing of possible Advisory Committee members for the Adult Education Division was submitted to the Board for review as to desirability. It was further requested that additional suggestions be made for this committee by the Board members.

18. CANVASS OF ELECTION --

The Iowa law provides that all Boards of Education must meet on the Monday following the regular school election at 2:00 p.m. or 7:30 p.m. for the purpose of canvassing the election and organizing the Board.

It has been customary for the Des Moines Board to observe the 2:00 p.m. hour. However, a quorum could not be obtained on Monday, September 16, so the canvass is being conducted today. Members of the Board will canvass the returns made by the precinct judges. When this has been completed, the following action should be taken incorporating any corrections which may be reported:
