#### A. Cash Position

Having received our 1st quarter, FY 82, General State Aid payment as of Sept 1st (\$1,728,709) we were able to pay off the stamped warrant being held at the end of August, and with tuition and other lessor revenue receipted during September, we were further able to pay vendors during the month without using borrowed funds. However, we were short \$518,280 cash required to cover September payroll on Sept 30th, and were required to go on a Stamped Warrant for that amount. Interest expense for this stamped warrant was negotiated for a rate of 10 3/4%, a reduction of the 11½% maximum rate allowed.

On October 1st we received our 4th quarter FY 81 Vocational Aid reimbursement (\$551,926), and at that time was able to liquidate the stamped warrant. Since the DPI has advised us that our 2d quarter General State Aid payment will likely not be released by State Comptroller until December, and since due date for payment by taxpayers of property taxes has been extended to Oct 16th, it is probable that we will again be required to go on a stamped warrant basis to cover October, and perhaps part of November payrolls.

Interest being allowed on investments has continued to be at a high point during the month. A short term investment was purchased with Student Union and Activities and Loan Fund monies at a negotiated rate of 16.5%. State Treasurer has continued to allow banks to negotiate such interest rates rather than follow previous procedure of establishing a maximum allowed to be paid.

#### Budget Balance

The General Fund Working Budget has been adjusted to reflect an estimated \$300,000 increase resulting from FY 82 contract salary settlements. A more exacting budget revision broken down by Cost Centers and functional areas is in the process of being compiled.

The Restricted Current Fund Working Budget presently reflects a budget for the CETA Class Size Project with continuation into the new Federal Fiscal Year, which started October 1st, with no reduction in staff or programs. The contract for this project is pending being approved, however, is anticipated being at a reduced level of funding and programs.

An addition to the Restricted Current Fund Budget this month was \$57,320 for the General Motors Training Project, just getting started.

The Budget Balance Report for September indicates budgeted expenses in excess of budgeted revenue by \$59,751. This difference would need to be taken from existing fund balance if the budget figures are realized by fiscal year end.

#### C. Balance Sheet

The General Fund Interim Balance Sheet for Sept 30th further denotes that with current working budget identical to actual revenue and disbursements for this fiscal year, the projected year end fund balance would be reduced by \$59,751 down to \$628,199.
